

No. 73844; from Austin chalk, in bed of Salado Creek, one mile below crossing of Austin road, about 3.5 miles east of north of Alamo Heights, Bexar County. 4.—Dorsal view of holotype, \times 1.44, Cat. No. 73845; from Taylor marl, at Guadalupe River, a few hundred yards above I. G. N. Railway bridge, one mile east of New Braunfels, Comal County.

1, 2.—Upper and outer views of dactyl of right cheliped, \times 1.44 (244); from Pawpaw elay, in Sycamore Creek valley, $\pm 4\frac{1}{2}$ miles southeast of Fort Worth and half a mile northeast of loc. 209, Tarrant County. 3-5.—Prehensile and outer views of left fixed finger and outer view of left movable finger, \times 1.44 (211); from 3 miles north of Denison, south bank of Duck Creek, 40 feet above base of Kde type-locality, in marl above *Pervinquieria aff. trinodosa*, Grayson County.

FIGURE 6.—Necrocarcinus (?) sp. Fragment of carapace, $\times 2.16$; W. S. Adkins (209), University of Texas; from Pawpaw clay, $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles southeast of Fort Worth, a quarter of a mile south of I. G. N. Railway bridge across Sycamore Creek, Tarrant County, Texas. [See page 46.]


FIGURES 7, 8.—Menippe cretacea Rathbun, n.sp. Outer views of dactyl and fixed finger (holotype) of right cheliped, \times .72, Cat. No. 73827; Woodbine formation at Timber Creek, 4 miles due west of Lewisville, Denton County, Texas, and a few hundred yards below a road bridge. [See page 57.]

No. 73793 (See above, figs. 13, 14). 18.—Outer view of left chela, \times 1.08, Cat. No. 73794; from Peedee formation, at Davis Landing, right bank, Peedee River, Florence County, South Carolina.
