

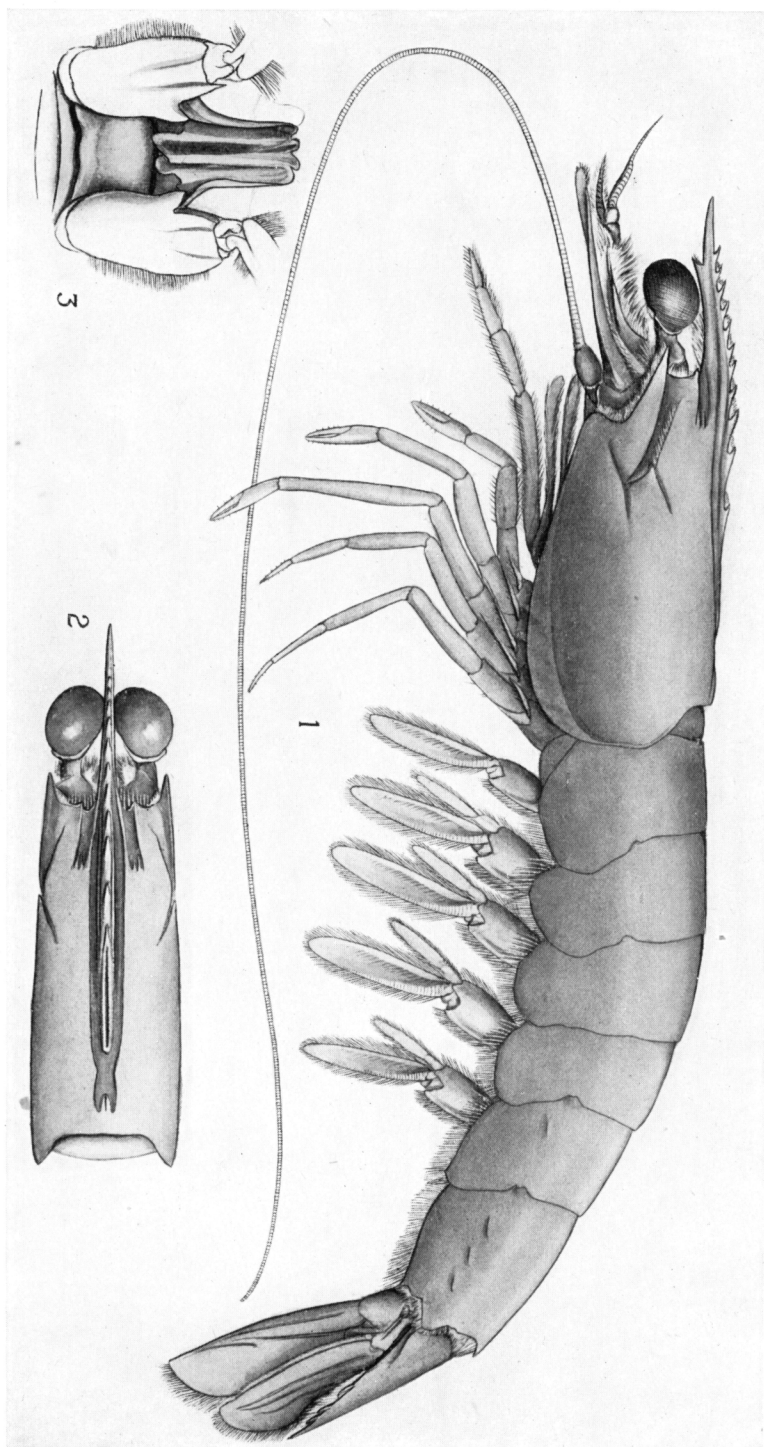

*Peneus maccullochi* sp. nov.

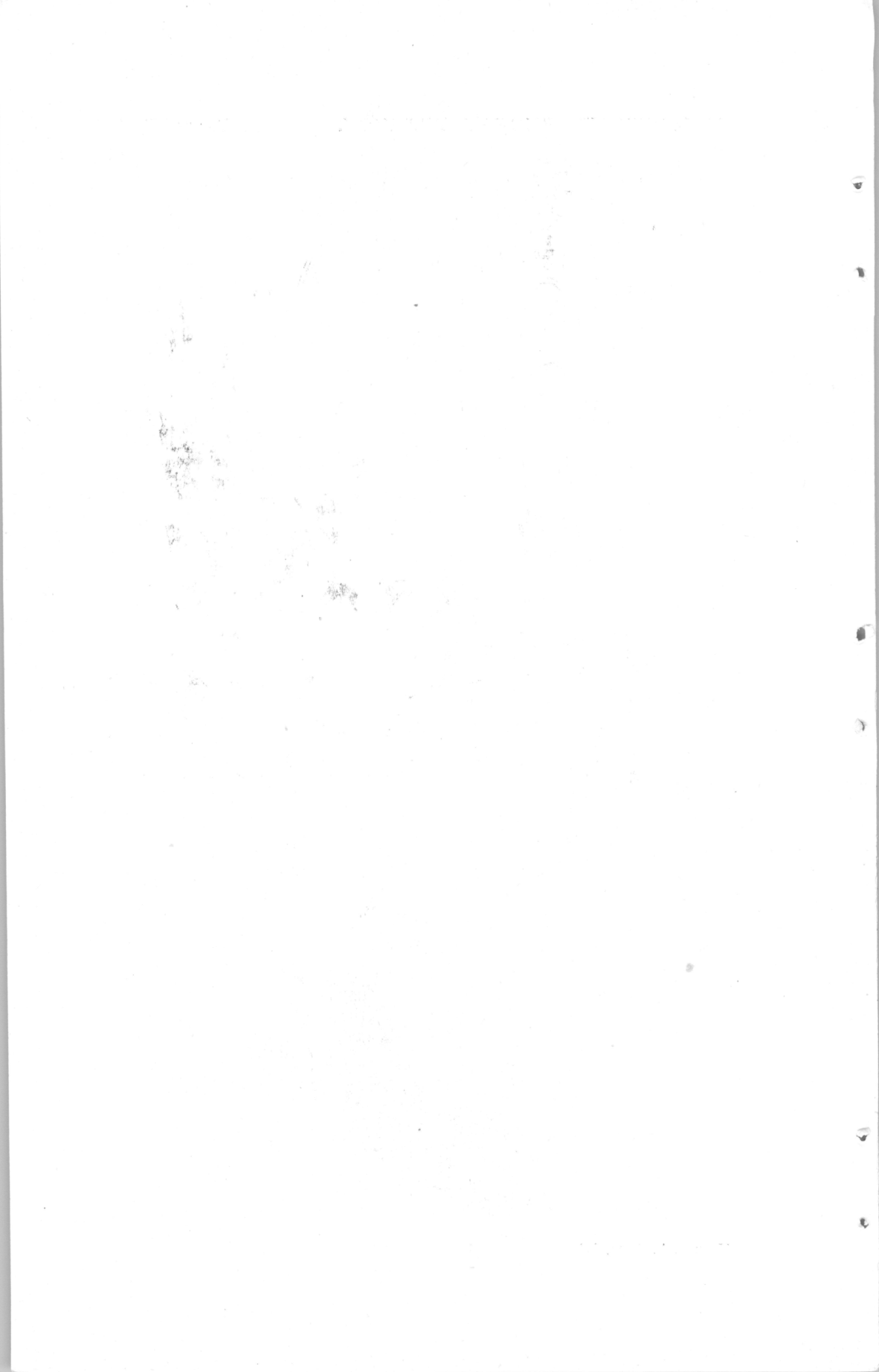
Fig. 1. Lateral view of the male holotype. Carapace and rostrum 58 mm. long.
